LIFE GROUP SERMON SUMMARY QUESTIONS

JAMES

These questions are for the **July 12, 2015 Sermon**, "Authentic Faith, Part 1." Please read the sermon passage (James 2:14-19) together out loud.

Sermon Outline:

AUTHENTIC FAITH IN JESUS CHRIST IS . . .

- 1. Made evident by our works (14)
 - A. Works provide credentials for our faith.
 - B. Works should show the world that what we say about what we believe is real.
- 2. Made distinguishable by our compassion (15-17)
 - A. The people around us should see tangible kindnesses in the lives of true Christ-followers.
 - B. Faith without any works is truly dead. It's just talk.
- 3. Made observable by our convictions (18-19)
 - A. The work that truly saves any believer is the work of Jesus Christ.
 - B. Demons believe and shudder. Believers believe and grow into the likeness of Christ.

Life Group Discussion Questions

- Based on #1, above: If you were accused of being a Christ-follower, would your changed life and works provide evidence of your conversion? Talk about where you see evidence and good works in the life of someone present here tonight.
- 2. Based on #1, above: We regularly emphasize that salvation comes by belief in Christ and faith in his work alone. But grapple with this quote from John Calvin: "Salvation is by faith alone, but not by faith which remains alone."
- 3. Based on #2, above: If we have the means to help others but only wish them well while doing nothing, the world around us sees a dead faith. The world will see Christ more clearly when believers "Stand up and stand out even if they stand alone." Discuss.
- 4. Based on #2, above: How has someone in this group shown a tangible kindness to those around us?
- 5. Based on #3, above: Demons believe but do not submit. Believers believe and draw near to God in submission. There are those who simply say true things--they are not necessarily true believers. There are those who know true things--and it may even effect their emotions (like the demons). But true converts are impacted at the heart level--the seat of the very soul. Are you a talker, a "knower," or a true convert?
