LIFE GROUP SERMON SUMMARY QUESTIONS

These questions are for the **April 10, 2016** sermon, "The Work Ethic." Please read the sermon passage (2 Thessalonians 3:6-10) together out loud.

Sermon Outline:

AS WE PURSUE A BIBLICAL WORK ETHIC, NOTE . . .

- 1. The teachings God has given His people (6)
 - A. People who had the ability and opportunity to work were refusing to do so.
 - B. They awaited Christ's return, but needed financial support from others as they waited.
 - C. Scriptures clearly teach us that . . .
 - i. God exalted work, and commanded it (Exodus 20:9-10)--the fourth commandment.
 - ii. God himself is constantly at work, as is Christ and the Holy Spirit.
 - iii. God instructed man to work the garden (Genesis 2:15) BEFORE the fall.
 - iv. Work is a gift from God for our dignity, which will continue into eternity.
 - v. Work can be done for God's glory even in difficult situations (1 Cor 10:31; Gal 6:5-7)
 - D. The big problem with idleness is that it . . .
 - i. allows sin to live in the church. It is willful disobedience to the Lord and His Word.
 - ii. brings dissension into the church by straining relationships needlessly.
 - iii. allows a brother or sister to miss the blessing of work.
 - E. Withhold relationship from those who can work but refuse to do so.
- 2. The example God has given His people (7-9)
 - A. Paul worked to pay his own way so that his example would be seen by all.
 - B. We, the people of God, ought to imitate his example.
- 3. The warning God has given His people (10)
 - A. Let the natural consequences of laziness have their effect in a lazy person's life.
 - B. If someone who calls himself a brother will not work, he should not eat.

Life Group Discussion Questions

- 1. Based on #1, above: We should not be so focused on Christ's return that we have a "can't wait to get out of here" mindset. In what ways do you sometimes struggle with that mindset? How does God want you to be faithful right to the end?
- 2. Based on #1, above: Talk about how Christ instructs his people to be willing to work, and then also to do our work with excellence. (1 Cor 10:31)
- 3. Based on #1, above: How can we as parents make certain that we are teaching our children a Christian work ethic when many of their peers may be talking about socialism and working less?
- 4. Based on #2, above: Who has been an example to you of working really hard and really well without making work or money into an idol?
- 5. Based on #3, above: Have you ever had to let natural consequences teach someone you loved a hard lesson? How did you handle that situation well? What did you learn from it?
