If you are newer to the church or just ready to get plugged-in, we are so thankful you are considering ABFs. We believe that ABFs are the perfect "first step" for people to get to know the church, get to know other people and grow in their own faith.

Our ABFs intend to carry out one vision, "Multiplying committed followers of Jesus Christ."

What is an "ABF"?

Adult Bible Fellowships exist to multiply disciples in smaller groups (between 20-40 people). Each ABF is led, or taught, by an elder of the church.

How are they organized?

ABFs are loosely organized around life stages. There is not a preferred ABF based only on age. You might find that it is helpful to check out a couple different ABFs to find the one that is just right for you. All ABFs teach the Word of God with practical application for living and support for each of us as we seek to multiply disciples.

How do I choose an ABF?

To determine the best fit for you, note the descriptions of ABFs found in this brochure. The church's weekly bulletin will provide regular updates regarding what each ABF is studying. The next step is simply to visit. There is no registration process. You can visit any of the ABFs whenever you are ready.
